Gardening: The Council of Management have organised a new professional gardener Mark Tapply who will be starting very shortly.

It is proposed to re-invigorate the composting area in the Dinghy Park exclusively for the disposal of the grass cuttings from the green and other communal areas. Members are requested to make their own arrangements for the disposal of their garden waste via for example the Havant Borough Council green bag scheme.

Dinghy Park: Work to repair the south fence of the dinghy park is scheduled for later in the summer. To facilitate this work there will be a working party on the 19th July to clean up the dinghy park and rearrange the boats to give access to the south fence. Members are requested to support this working party.

Members are once again reminded of the requirement under the terms of the lease to get prior approval from the Council of Management for alterations to their property, this includes driveways, and also of the need to get prior agreement from any affected neighbours before undertaking any works. If in any doubt as to whether Council of Management approval is needed please ask.

Our current minute secretary has expressed a desire to step down from the role after several years' excellent service. The Council of Management would like to firstly thank Mrs Gebbett for all her efforts and ask the membership for a volunteer to take on this role which gives an excellent insight into the workings of Maisemore Gardens.
