Summary of Incidents during May

Burglary Dwellings

18/05/2015 – Garland Avenue – Residential property broken into overnight. Laptops, car keys stolen from inside and the car stolen from the driveway of the property. **Current investigation ongoing.**

Suspicious Incidents

07/05/2015 – Wickor Way – Report of 2 males seen looking around the outside of a property in Wickor Way. **Police deployed and an area search conducted no trace. Photos of the 2 males have been circulated to try to identify those involved.**

07/05/2015 – Horndean Rec, Horndean Road – Report of three cars parked in the car park, the occupants possibly using drugs. **Police deployed, but no cars present on arrival and obvious signs of drug use in the area.**

17/05/2015 – Clovelly Road – Report of a male walking along the road filming the properties as he walked along. **Police deployed and an area search conducted, no persons located matching the description.**

30/05/2015 – Lindens Close – Report of two male youths on bikes acting suspicious in the close and leaving the area when seen by residents. **Incident noted by the Emsworth Neighbourhood Policing Team who will monitor similar activity whilst on patrols.**

Anti Social Behaviour related incidents

02/05/2015 – Cranesbill Court – Report of a noisy party being held in one of the properties. **Police attended and resident agreed to turn music down.**

03/05/2015 – New Brighton Road – Report of a group of youths smoking cannabis in the bus shelter on New Brighton Road. **Police deployed and area search conducted no trace of the group of youths.**

22/05/2015 – Palmers Road – Report of youths riding mopeds/motorbikes around the public car park in Palmers Road. **Youths had left the area prior to police arrival. The Emsworth Neighbourhood Policing Team will continue to monitor this area.**

Other News- Hampshire Alert

Some of you may have already heard about Hampshire Alert which is a new community message system – this enables us to send you messages about incidents that are happening in your area.

www.hampshirealert.co.uk is a free web based system which you can sign up to and choose what information you want to receive and in what format, email, text or phone message. So the alert is personal to you.

The alert system is straightforward and you can still receive all the relevant information you require, plus additional information on topics of interest which has previously been unavailable to you.

By using Hampshire Alert you will be one step ahead. You will be notified of relevant information/warning/crime much more quickly, and you won't miss out on important updates on incidents occurring in your locality.

Hampshire Alert is nothing like Facebook, Twitter or any other social media site. All the information is kept secure and private; you do not need to set up a social page or add pictures.

Once registered, you only need to log into the system to update your details or preferences. Alerts will be sent to your chosen email or phone number.

This newsletter often informs you of incidents that have happened some time ago so by using Hampshire Alert you can be notified of current incidents as they are happening.

I'd ask everyone to please sign up, so please pass this information onto any residents if they are in Neighbourhood watch or not.

Crime Prevention Advice

We would like to remind residents to consider the following as the temperatures start to warm up:

- Keep ground floor or accessible windows shut and locked in rooms you are not using.
- Don't leave doors and patio doors open.
- Remember to lock up properly before going to bed.
- Remember, insurance companies will often refuse to pay out if a burglary is a result of an insecurity.
- If you are taking the opportunity to do some DIY to your home, don't leave ladders and tools out. Keep them locked up.
- Make sure you lock side and rear gates, which provide access into your garden.
- Do not do business at the door. Companies who tout at the door for gardening and home improvements often turn out to be bogus.
- If you are in the back garden having a barbeque party, don't be tempted to leave the front door open for your visitors to let themselves in.
- If you are going out for the evening remember to use a timer switch on a lamp or radio to give the impression someone is home.
- Hot weather is a good opportunity to get out cycling. Remember to lock your bike using a decent "D" lock, even if leaving for only a couple of minutes.
- Remember to shut car windows and sunroofs, even if parked on your drive.
- If you are working in the garden, remember not to leave expensive power tools lying around, even for a couple of minutes.
- Scrap metal has a high value, so be careful about leave barbeques or other such items in view, as they may be taken.
- Check the security of sheds and garages and make sure it is adequate.
- While working on the garden, make sure you check boundary fences and walls to ensure they are in good order.
